* Projections are good faith estimates for planning purposes. Tuition and fees are subject to change without notice. As a public institution, tuition levels are significantly affected by federal and state funding. The School of Dentistry's academic calendar (summer/fall/spring) varies from the University's financial aid calendar (fall/spring/summer). The first year of dental school does not include a summer semester. Students advance to the next academic year after spring semester. Be aware that financial aid is awarded each summer according to the University's financial aid calendar, meaning that D2 Summer aid will be offered in the same aid year as the D1 Fall & Spring aid, etc.

^A International students in the 4-year DDS program pay the non-resident rate, and are assessed two additional fees each semester by International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS): *International Student Aid/Engagement Fee* (\$8 Summer 2017; \$14 each F/Sp) and the *International Student Support Services Fee* (\$70 Summer 2017; \$165 each F/Sp). International students in the Program for Advanced Standing Students (PASS) have a different tuition structure; consult the PASS office for more information.

¹ Textbooks & General Supplies: The amount of aid offered for textbooks and general supplies is a set amount of \$1,000 per semester. Actual needs may vary by course and semester; amounts listed above include only required textbooks, if purchased at full price from the University Bookstore. Students may check the course syllabus for textbook information. DDS4 students will not be required to purchase any new textbooks.

² Living Expenses: The amounts shown for Room and Board, Transportation, and Personal/Miscellaneous expenses are estimates based on the University's surveys of housing (one-bedroom apartments) in the University area and on government statistics for weekly food consumption, transportation, and personal/miscellaneous expenses. You are not required to accept the full amount of the loan offered to you. It is recommended that you borrow only what is needed for your unique situation, in consideration of any other funding sources and variations in individual living expenses. If too much aid is accepted, it is possible to return aid by contacting the Office of Student Finance.

³ Loan Origination Fees: This amount is offered in financial aid packages to offset the cost of loan origination fees. Actual loan fees depend on the loan type and amount of aid accepted.

⁴ Health Insurance Requirement: Students are required to have health insurance coverage, and may submit a Cost of Attendance Appeal to include the cost of health insurance in their financial aid assessment. Students may elect to purchase the University's Student Health Benefit Plan (SHBP) or private insurance. The 2017-2018 rates for SHBP single student coverage are \$1050 each for Fall and Spring semesters; Summer is included if the student was enrolled in the SHBP the previous spring.

⁵ Additional Expenses: Additional educational costs not included in the Cost of Attendance estimate may include, for example, uniforms and board exams. Consult the "Explanation of DDS Projected Cost of Attendance" sheet for more information. If needed, a Cost of Attendance Appeal may be submitted to the Graduate and Professional Office of Student Finance if the student finds that the amount of aid does not adequately cover eligible expenses.

Tuition

Dental school tuition and fees are charged each semester. Billing and payment options can be found through OneStop (<https://onestop.umn.edu/finances/billing-and-payment>).

The School of Dentistry's academic calendar (summer/fall/spring) varies from the University's financial aid calendar (fall/spring/summer). The first year of dental school does not include a summer semester. Students advance to the next academic year after spring semester. *Be aware that financial aid is awarded each summer according to the University's financial aid calendar, meaning that D2 Summer aid will be offered in the same aid year as the D1 Fall & Spring aid, etc.*

The School of Dentistry carefully considers tuition and fee increases and we do all we can to keep these rates as low as possible for students. Please note these rates are estimates only and are subject to change without notice. As a public institution, tuition levels are significantly affected by both federal and state funding. The amounts provided are good faith estimates for planning purposes but may be more or less depending on various external factors.

Fees

Capital Enhancement Fee	Required of all students on the Twin Cities campus. Supports capital financing for facilities that contribute to or enhance student life.
Course Fees	Fees required for course materials and equipment.
Dentistry Collegiate Fee (Equipment)	Provides updated course equipment in the school's clinic, including dental chairs, lights, and units. Also applied to costs associated with computers and printers for students' use.
Dentistry Instrument Usage Fee	Supports clinical instrument, sterilization, and gown expenses.
Dentistry Interactive Audio Fee	Supports interactive classroom tools used for interactive quizzes and clicker questions during large group seminars for dental students didactic/clinical training. This fee is only charged in the fall semester of the first year.
Dentistry Oral Anatomy Tooth CD-ROM Fee	Required Oral Anatomy Tooth Explorer CD provided for all D1 students.
Professional Student Government (PSG) Fee	Assessed each term to degree-seeking students in professional programs.
International Student Aid Fee	Required of all students who hold temporary nonimmigrant visas.
International Student Fee	Administrative fee for orientation and advising, required of all students who hold temporary nonimmigrant visas.

Long-Term Disability Insurance Fee (AHC)	Charged to all Academic Health Center (AHC) students. When paid in fall and spring, the insurance covers a full calendar year (including the following summer semester).
Stadium Fee	The student stadium fee supports the construction costs and debt service of the on-campus football stadium that also serves the marching band, intramural and club sports, student activities, and other University functions.
Student Health Benefit Plan <i>(not included in Cost of Attendance estimates)</i>	All students must have health insurance. If a student elects to purchase the Student Health Benefit Plan (SHBP) or private insurance, a cost of attendance appeal may be submitted to include this amount in their cost of attendance for financial aid (if private insurance is purchased, up to the rate of the SHBP may be included). The rates for the 2016-2017 academic year for single student coverage are \$1050 per Fall and Spring semester (Summer semester is automatically covered if the student paid for the SHBP in the previous Spring semester). The Student Health Benefit Plan will show up on tuition charges in August, and the student may choose to waive this fee if covered by other insurance.
Student Services Fee	All students registered for 6 or more credits must pay a student services fee in addition to tuition. All students who pay the fee are automatically members of the University Recreation and Wellness Center.
Transportation Fee	Non-refundable fee to support the U Pass bus transit program assessed to all students.

Books & Supplies

Textbooks	Amounts will vary depending on where books are purchased and whether the books are new or used. The totals in the SOD estimated Cost of Attendance document are for required, new books purchased through the University Bookstore. Non-required books are not included in the estimate. The amount of financial aid offered for Books and Supplies is a flat rate of \$1,000 per semester, to include costs for general supplies, such as computing equipment and notebooks, etc.
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Living Expenses

The amounts shown for living expenses are estimates based on the University's survey of housing (one-bedroom apartments) in the University area and on government statistics for weekly food consumption, transportation and personal/miscellaneous expenses. Additional Educational Expenses*

* Additional Educational Expenses are not included in the projected Cost of Attendance, as the quantity of items purchased and time of year the cost is incurred varies by student, or the charges are collected by an organization other than the University. Students may request a Cost of Attendance appeal from the Office of Student Finance to see if the costs of these items can be included in financial aid offers.

Lab Coat/White Coat (Approximately \$50)	All incoming first year DDS students are required to have 2 lab coats (Notify Student Affairs of your coat size by July 1 st prior to Orientation to place an order). The first coat is free, courtesy of the School of Dentistry Alumni Society. The second coat is required for DDS students, paid for at Orientation.
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U Card (Vertical design) (Free or \$25 for replacement)	In lieu of name tags, the School of Dentistry dress code requires students to wear their University issued U Card as an ID badge. The updated (<i>as of 2015</i>) U Card has a vertical design. New UMN students receive a free U Card; incoming students who had a U Card with an older horizontal design from prior study may need to replace their card for the newer vertical badge.
Scrubs (Approximately \$40/set)	The School of Dentistry dress code requires students to wear a set of matching scrubs (navy blue for DDS) with the requisite dentistry emblem. Students may determine the number of sets required, but generally find it is helpful to have five sets, one for each day of the week. <i>Purchase scrubs online only through:</i> http://www.signatureconcepts.com/uofmdental/default.aspx
Loupes & Light (Not required)	During the beginning of the spring semester the first year class officers hold a loupes fair where outside vendors come to advertise their loupes and lights. Although loupes and lights are not required by the school, many students opt to purchase them. Costs are around \$1,000-\$1,500 per pair.
NBDE Part I Exam Fees (Approximately \$395)	Per the School's policy, students take this exam in the D2 spring semester.
NBDE Part II Exam Fees (Approximately \$440)	Per the School's policy, students take this exam in the D4 summer or fall semester.
Regional Licensure Exam Costs	Students should budget for exam fees, required supplies (such as teeth and typodonts), and travel expenses, if applicable, for CRDTS or other state/regional licensure exams.
Immunization Costs	All students in the Academic Health Center are required to get necessary immunizations, some which must be updated as needed throughout your program, according to the AHC policy. Depending on your health insurance, immunizations may or may not be covered. Covered Expenses and Reimbursements

Outreach Travel Expenses	Students are required to participate in outreach rotations in their D4 year. Lodging will be provided for rural sites, and costs for travel to qualifying sites can be reimbursed in the amount of \$300 from the AHC 1Health Interprofessional Rural Rotation Scholarship. Not all SOD outreach sites qualify (Twin Cities sites), because the cost to students is not expected to increase beyond what would normally be incurred if the student were at the School of Dentistry.
Tuberculin Skin Test (TST) Screening Clinic Monthly in the CHIP lounge in Moos Tower, or by appointment at Boynton Health Service	A Tuberculosis Screening is required annually for all AHC students. If you are enrolled in the AHC Student Health Benefit Plan, the cost of this service will be covered by the plan. If you have private health insurance and pay the University of Minnesota Student Services Fee, your health insurance will be billed first and the Student Services Fee will cover any charges not paid by your health insurance (as long as the TST is administered by the Boynton Health Service or the monthly TST clinic offered in Moos Tower).
